Court Reporting Network (CRN) & Alcohol Highway Safety Program (AHSP) Information

Location:

Carbon County Adult Probation Parole Department at 76 Susquehanna Street, Jim Thorpe, PA

Carbon County is certified through the Alcohol Highway Safety Program (AHSP) of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to provide this 12.5-hour class. Instructors are certified through the PA DUI Association under the auspices of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

The objectives of the AHSP are to provide students with a basic knowledge and understanding of alcohol and controlled substances and their effects on metabolism and judgment, alcoholism and drug use, as well as highway safety, to encourage a positive change in student's attitude concerning driving under the influence of alcohol, controlled substance or prescription medication. It is all classroom instruction. There is no driving involved in this program.

Court Reporting Network (CRN): \$80.00

- Discount of \$10.00 when paid at the Clerk of Courts prior to case disposition. (Placement in ARD program/guilty plea sentencing/sentencing).

Alcohol Highway Safety Program Classes (AHSP): \$425.00

- \$50.00 discount on the AHSP when the person pays for the class prior to case disposition. ((Placement in ARD program/guilty plea sentencing/sentencing).
- **Repeat Offenders: 2nd or Subsequent DUI Offenders: \$425.00 for AHSP plus an additional \$150.00**

Class Schedule:

- 4 consecutive evenings from 5:00pm – 8:30pm 1st Class, 2nd-4th: 5:00pm-8:00pm
- 2 consecutive Saturdays from 9:00am – 4:00pm as needed
- Multiple Offender Class as needed.

CRNs and AHSP will be scheduled at the Carbon County Correctional Facility as needed.

***Attendance is mandatory under Pennsylvania law. Failure to attend will be reported to the Court and/or your Probation Officer which may result in revocation of supervision being initiated in your case. You must attend all scheduled classes unless granted an excused absence by the DUI Administration staff of the Adult Probation Department in advance.*
